The Many Shades of Love

Among terms which are used the most often, there is the one which is the most widespread among people. It is love. People use this term in various situations to describe many different emotions. According to Merriam-Webster's online dictionary, love is a "strong affection for another arising out of kinship or personal ties"; it is also an "attraction based on sexual desire" as well as "affection based on admiration, benevolence, or common interests" (n.d.). Love may not necessarily be directed toward relatives because it may be the feeling directed toward all of the people.
